Registrations for next year's Open Farm Sunday open next week (**1 December**) and organisers LEAF (Linking Environment And Farming) are encouraging farmers to sign up as early as possible.

To help and support host farmers to open on 8th June 2014, LEAF are organising a series of free Information Events*, running from early February to late April across Britain.
